



TTH Programme (all levels – Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma)

The Travel, Tourism and Hospitality (TTH) programme has undergone revision and the new revised programme, renamed Travel, Tourism and Hospitality Management (TTHM), will be examined for the first time in December 2008.

Below are the transition arrangements and information for students who are already on the current Travel, Tourism and Hospitality programme. **All new entrants** must follow the new revised programme structure – failure to enrol onto the correct programme or to take the correct examination subjects will result in students not completing a particular level or having to pass additional subjects (units).

Any passes already achieved in the current TTH programme will remain valid and be automatically transferred to the new revised programme in December 2008.

Certificate

From December 2008 onwards, examinations for Introduction to Travel Tourism and Hospitality will be based on the new syllabus for this subject (unit). All other syllabuses (Introduction to Business, Introduction to Business Communication and Introduction to Accounting) remain the same as for December 2007 and June 2008. You should familiarise yourselves with the new revised syllabus and the specimen question paper which may have changed format.

Diploma

From December 2008 onwards, all examinations will be based on the new revised TTH Management programme syllabuses. Two new subjects (units) have been added in Diploma Part 2;

- IT in Hospitality and Tourism Operations replaces Systems Analysis and Design (optional units)
- Customer Service Skills is a new optional unit

However, students who **already have a pass** Systems Analysis and Design can use this pass to complete the TTH Management Diploma instead of the new unit (IT in Hospitality and Tourism Operations) until **December 2009**. After this date, students will not be able to use this pass to complete the TTH Management Diploma.

You should familiarise yourselves with the new revised syllabuses and the specimen question papers which may have changed format.

Scenarios

1. A student has no passes in the TTH Diploma prior to December 2008. What should they do?

All new entrants onto the TTH Management programme should sit for exams following the new revised TTH Management programme structure.

2. A student has completed the Diploma Part 1 and has a pass in Systems Analysis and Design in Diploma Part 2. What should they do?

Students who have a pass in Systems Analysis and Design can use this pass instead of the new unit IT in Hospitality and Tourism Operations to complete the TTH Management Diploma **up to December 2009**. After this date, students will not be able to use this pass to complete the TTH Management Diploma.



3. A student has some passes in the TTH Diploma prior to December 2008. What should they do?

All students' passes will be automatically transferred on to the new TTH Management programme. Students will just have to pass the remaining outstanding units (so a total of nine units will need to be passed) in order to complete the TTH Management Diploma.

Advanced Diploma

From December 2008 onwards, all examinations will be based on the new revised TTH Management programme. One new unit has been added;

- Strategic Hospitality Management replaces Corporate Strategy and Planning.

All students on the TTH Management programme should sit this subject from December 2008.

However, students who already have a pass Corporate Strategy and Planning can use this pass to complete the TTH Management Advanced Diploma instead of the new unit until **December 2009**. After this date, students will not be able to use this pass to complete the TTH Management Advanced Diploma.

Please also note that Tourism and the Environment has been replaced with Sustainable Tourism Planning and Development and **from December 2008** all examination papers will be based on this syllabus, which has been developed from Tourism and the Environment. Passes in Tourism and the Environment will remain valid and will count for completion of the Advanced Diploma instead of Sustainable Tourism Planning and Development.

You should familiarise yourselves with the new revised syllabuses and the specimen question papers which may have changed format.

Please find overleaf, the structure of the current TTH programme (examined for the last time in June 2008) and the structure of the new revised TTH Management programme which will be examined for the first time in December 2008.
